## Principal Quinn's Corner:

Creating and fostering avid readers takes a partnership between home and school. Here are some suggestions for fostering independent reading from Reading Rockets website, a fabulous resource if you do not know it! Happy Reading! <http://www.readingrockets.org/>

- Help children find books that they will enjoy, such as books on topics that interest them, different book series, books by a favorite author, and so on. School and public librarians can be valuable resources for information about books on different topics and about various book series.
- Make sure the book is not too difficult. Poor readers will often pick a book that is too hard to "save face." However, even young children can understand the concept that optimal learning and enjoyment occur when something is at the right level of difficulty. Children should be able to read at least 95% of the words in a text accurately, or the book is too difficult for independent reading. If a particular book is of interest but just too hard for the child to read
