Konstella Korner: Q&A

How do I turn off text notifications for certain rooms/groups only? If you have the app, you can turn off notifications on a room-by-room basis. Go into the room, tap the icon at the top right, and use the notification slider to set your preference.

What's the difference between typing in a chat window and creating an announcement? Posting in the chat window is a quick, easy way to post a message in a group. Creating an announcement gives you more options, such as the ability to format the text, add an attachment, and receive responses via the "Comment" field (supported in a web browser only). The comments for an announcement do not trigger an a notification to the whole room, like replying in the chat window would. Creating an announcement also means you can go back to My Creations, open it, and edit or republish it.
