**6:10 pm Background regarding Decision about Move-back Date:** Liz Sullivan

In September of 2017 former Deputy Chief of Facilities Joe Dominguez informed the Glenview School Community that the new building would not be finished in time for the start of the 2019-2020 school year. He promised that the building would be finished in time for a mid-year, January 2020 move-back date. This topic was raised by parents during the Glenview Project Committee meetings in the summer. This led to a more in depth discussion among District leaders.

**6:15 pm Students will return to the Glenview Campus in August 2020:** Liz Sullivan

Construction of the new building is on track to be completed by December 2019, however, students will return to the Glenview Campus in August of 2020. We regret that it was previously communicated to families that Glenview students would return mid-year, in January 2020. From the start, the goal of building a seismically safe school has been our priority, and the previous commitment to a mid-year return was based solely on the construction timeline absent of other important factors. A more thorough analysis by leaders of the Academic and Legal Divisions and the new Deputy Chief of Facilities, Tim White, has led us to avoid a January 2020 return for the following reasons:

- A mid-year return would leave some of the Santa Fe neighborhood children stranded, looking for transportation to the Glenview neighborhood, or looking for another school.
- A mid-year return would result in a significant loss of instructional time for all students.
- A mid-year return would result in a significant gap in after school care because the new building needs to be licensed for Adventure Time.
- A mid-year return would violate labor agreements
